People of different ages





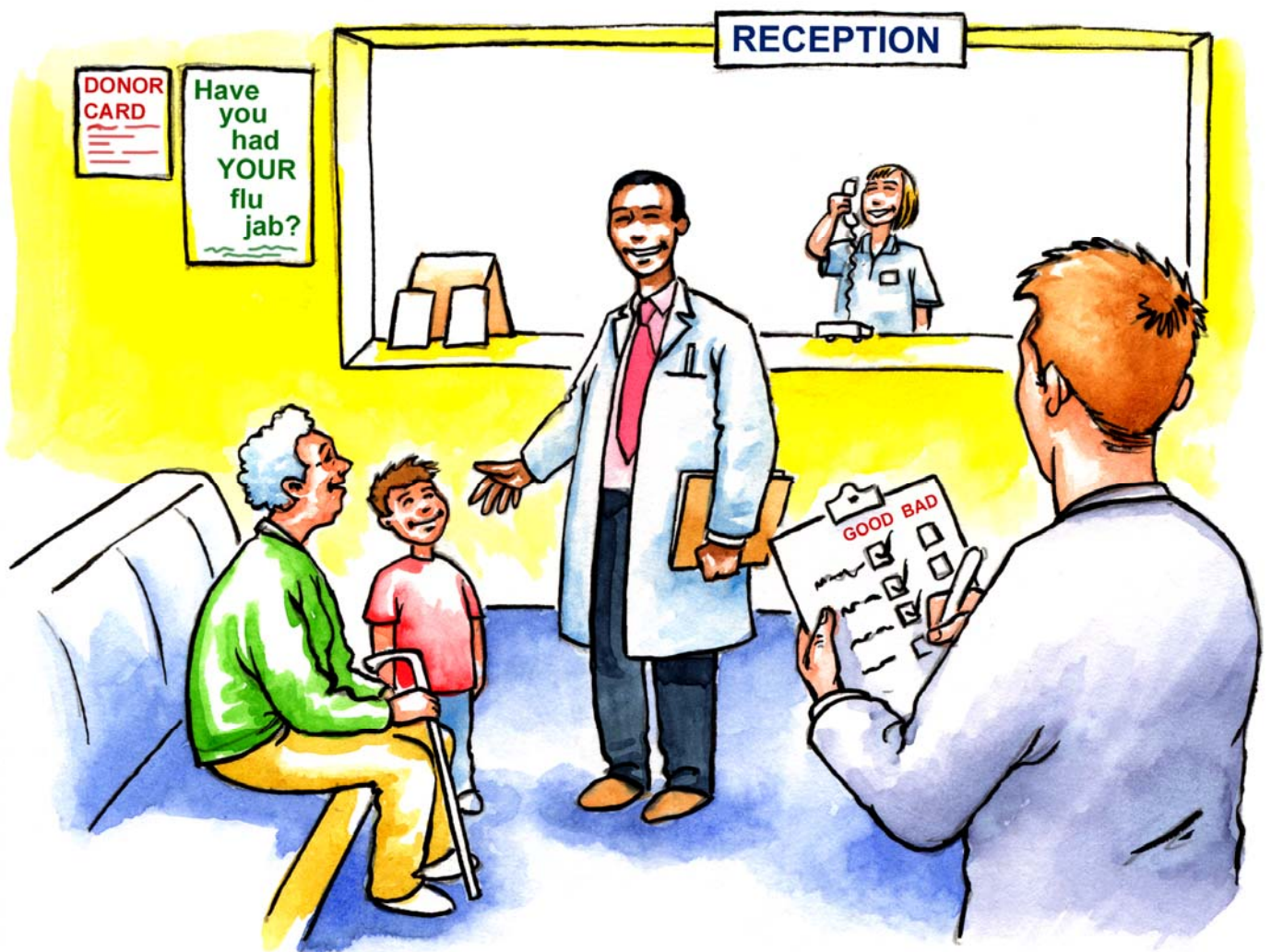
This Equality Scheme tells you how we will make things better for everyone who
