HRConnect, which is a new online service providing 24:7 access to a whole range of information and advice covering all of our human resources services. Whether it's advice on Occupational Health, Health and Safety, Recruitment, Workforce Planning, Organisational Development, or help with general human resources queries, you will find it at the click of a button, any time, day or night.

The HR Support and Advice Unit based at the West Glasgow Ambulatory Care Hospital will provide a 'one team, on one location' approach as HR comes together with Occupational Health, Health and Safety, Learning and Education and Organisational Development providing a single point of access to expert, consistent and customer focused advice and support. Recruitment, Staff Bank and Interpreting will complete the team when they move later in the summer.
