## Fire safety

Following a major blaze at a derelict building on the Stobhill campus, Sally Johnston, head of our civil contingencies unit, reminds staff who spot fires in derelict or empty buildings on NHS sites to first dial 999 and then inform the contact centre (switchboard) about its location giving a full description of the fire.

The response of staff to a recent fire on a ward in the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital (QUEH) is also a timely reminder to us all of the importance of fire safety training.

Described as “superb” staff at the QUEH knew their drill and reacted promptly and efficiently - they knew exactly what to do and they did it perfectly, reflecting well on their knowledge and the importance of our Learnpro Fire Safety module.
