

Journey times to Glasgow Royal Infirmary, Lightburn Hospital and Stobhill Hospital

Journey time was analysed using Strathclyde Passenger Transport and Google Maps websites and was based on Glasgow Royal Infirmary elderly inpatient data from March 2015 to April 2016 using postcode areas where more than 50 people attended in that year.

Total average time for catchment by public transport to GRI	94 minutes
Total average time for catchment by public transport to Lightburn	144 minutes
Total average time for catchment by public transport to Stobhill	129 minutes

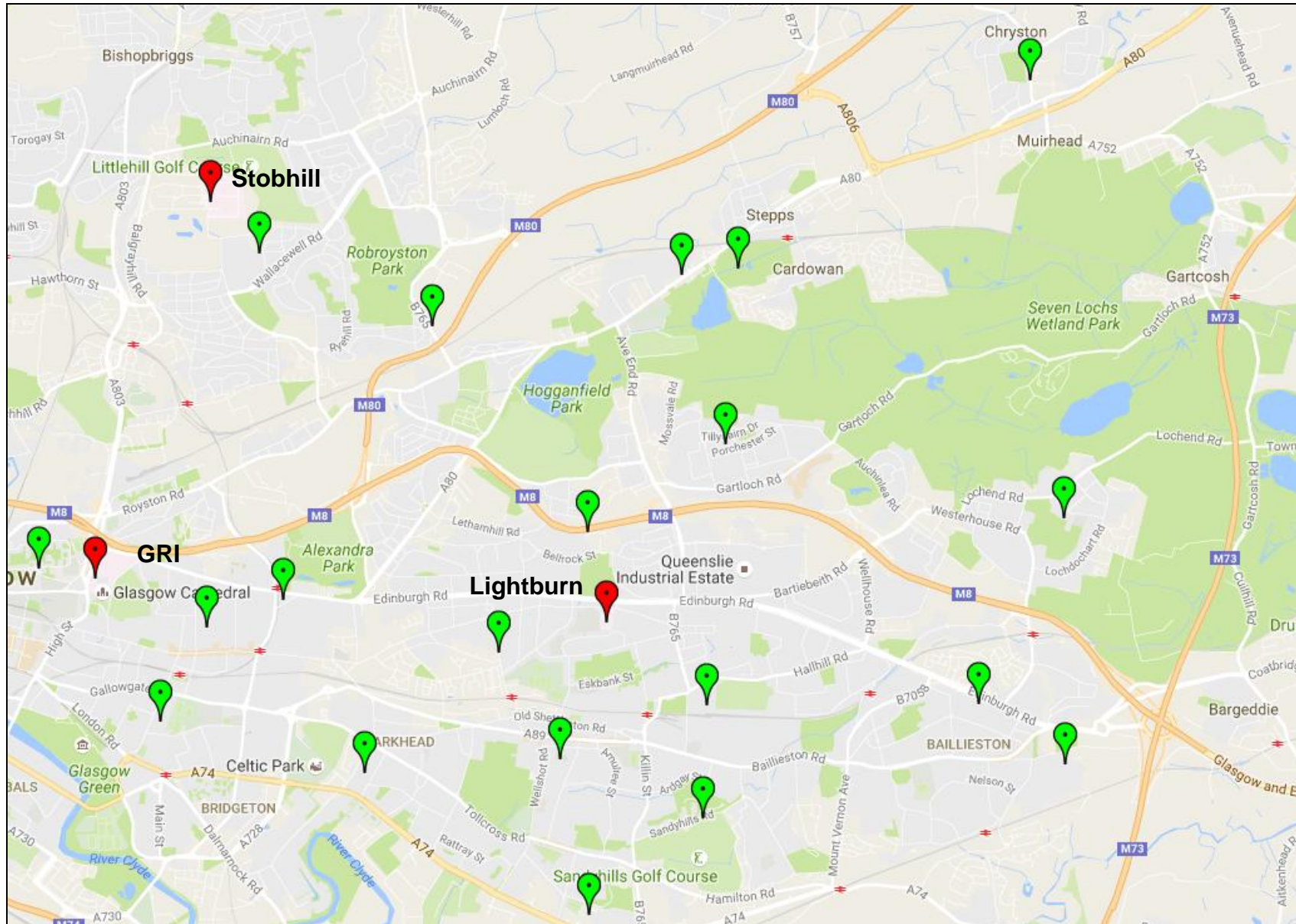
This table shows that for the whole catchment area the GRI is the quickest to get to, followed by Stobhill then Lightburn.

Table 3: Average time by car to each site

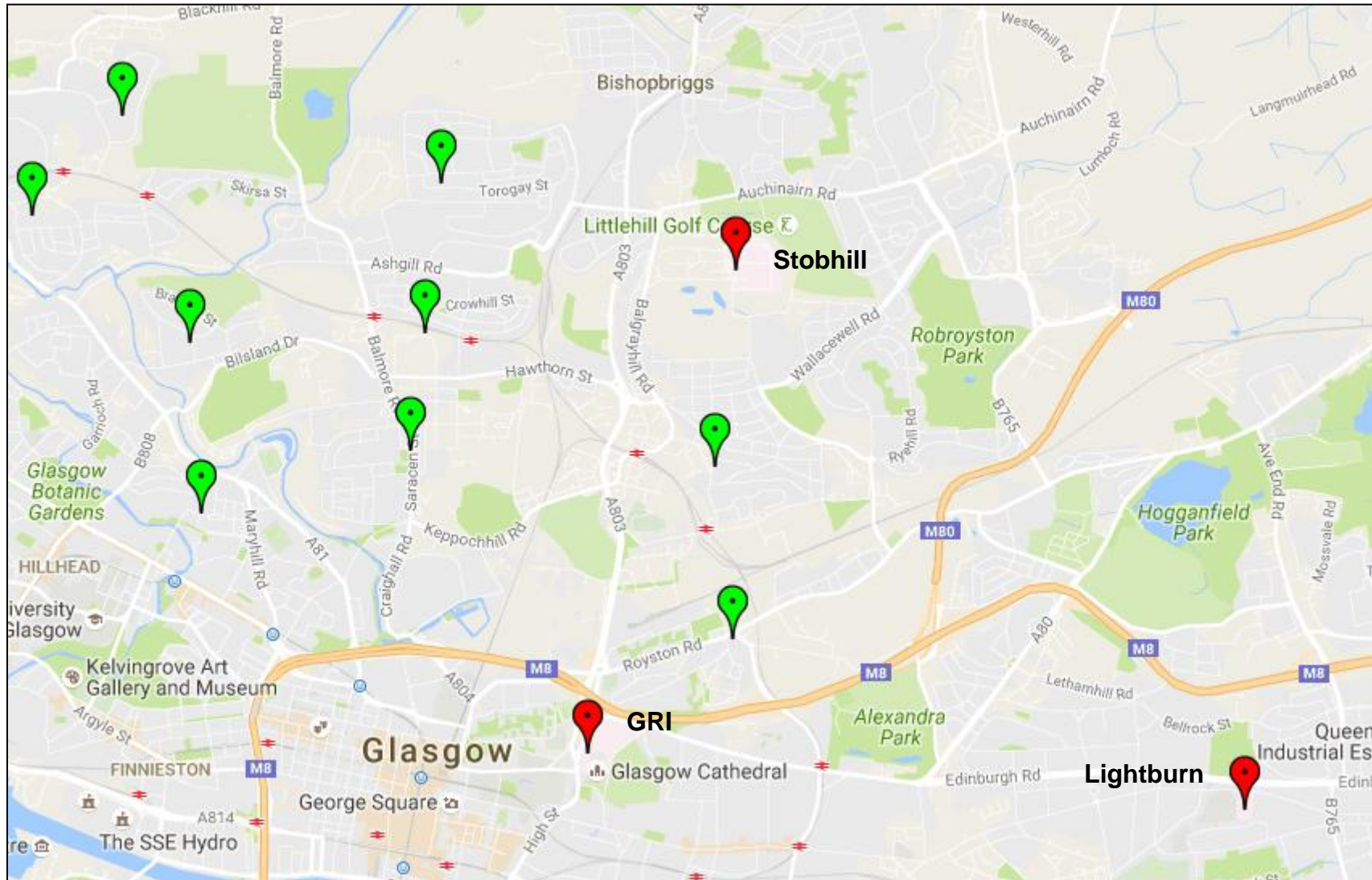
Total average time in minutes for catchment by car to GRI	43 minutes
Total average time in minutes for catchment by car to Lightburn	50 minutes
Total average time in minutes for catchment by car to Stobhill	41 minutes

This table shows that for the whole catchment area the GRI is the quickest to get to, followed by Stobhill then Lightburn.

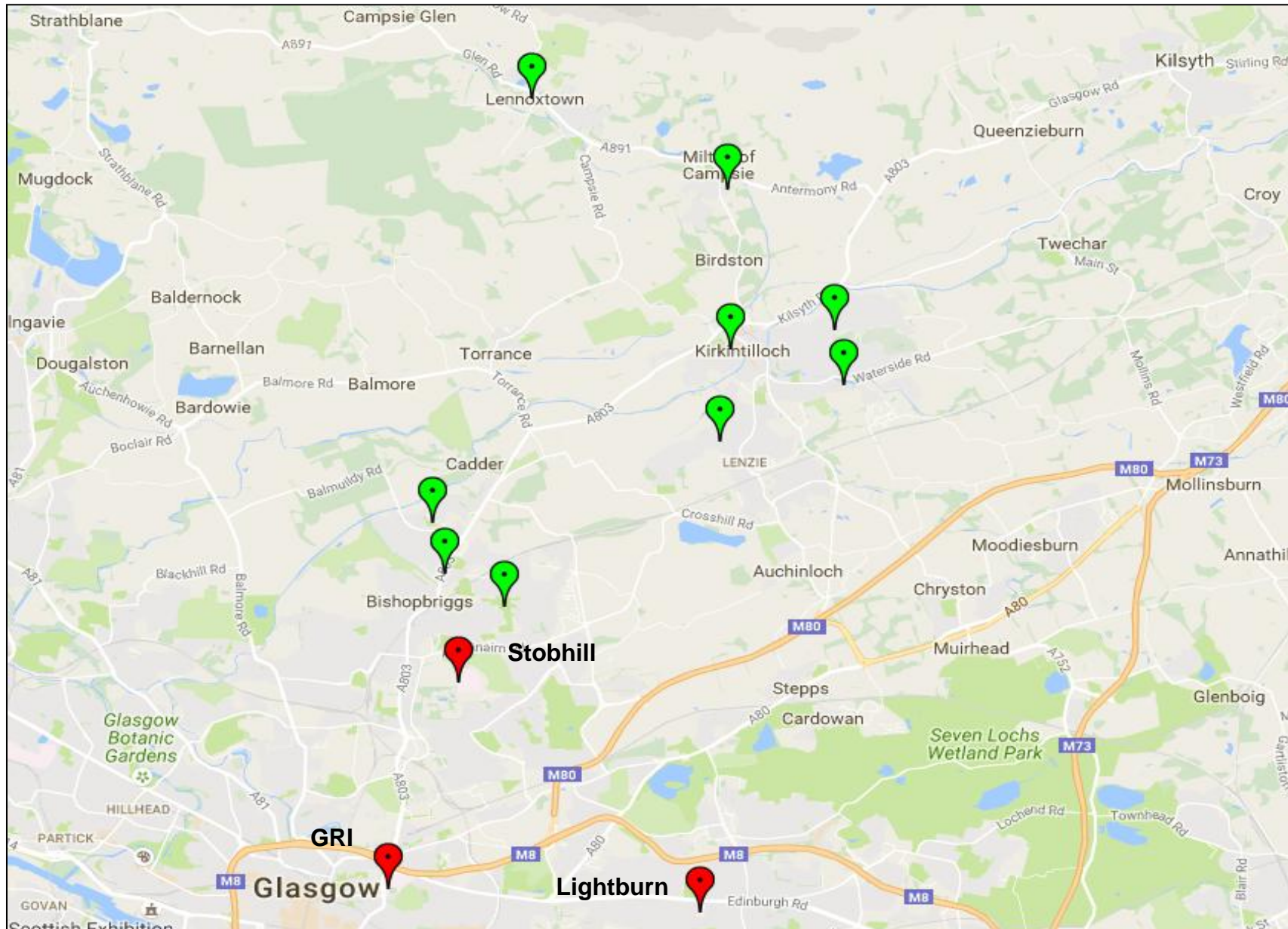
North East HSCP postcode areas looked at for travel to Glasgow Royal Infirmary, Lightburn Hospital and Stobhill Hospital

Lightburn Hospital Visitors Travel Survey

We carried out a snapshot survey of visitors to Lightburn Hospital inpatient wards over a one week period when we spoke to a total of 40 people to better understand:

- Where visitors travel from
- What mode of transport they used
- Who they were visiting and how often

All inpatients in Lightburn Hospital are transferred there from the Glasgow Royal Infirmary. The Glasgow Royal Infirmary serves a large geographical area across North and East Glasgow and East Dunbartonshire.

Where Visitors travelled from

- 29 came from the North East of Glasgow
- 4 came from East Dunbartonshire
- 7 came from outwith NHSGGC

Visitors travelled between 0.5 miles and 49 miles to get to Lightburn Hospital with the average distance travelled being 5 miles.

Of the 29 from the North East of Glasgow they travelled between 0.5 and 7 miles with the average being 2 miles.

What about Stobhill Hospital?

If all visitors were going to Stobhill Hospital they would have travelled between 2.5 and 47.5 miles with the average being 7.5 miles.

For the 29 visitors from the North East of Glasgow they would have travelled between 3 and 11 miles with the average being 5 miles.

What mode of transport visitors used

- 26 came by car
- 6 came by bus
- 4 came by taxi
- 4 came by foot

Of the 29 from the North and East of Glasgow 15 came by car and all those travelling by bus, taxi or on foot came from the North and East of the city.

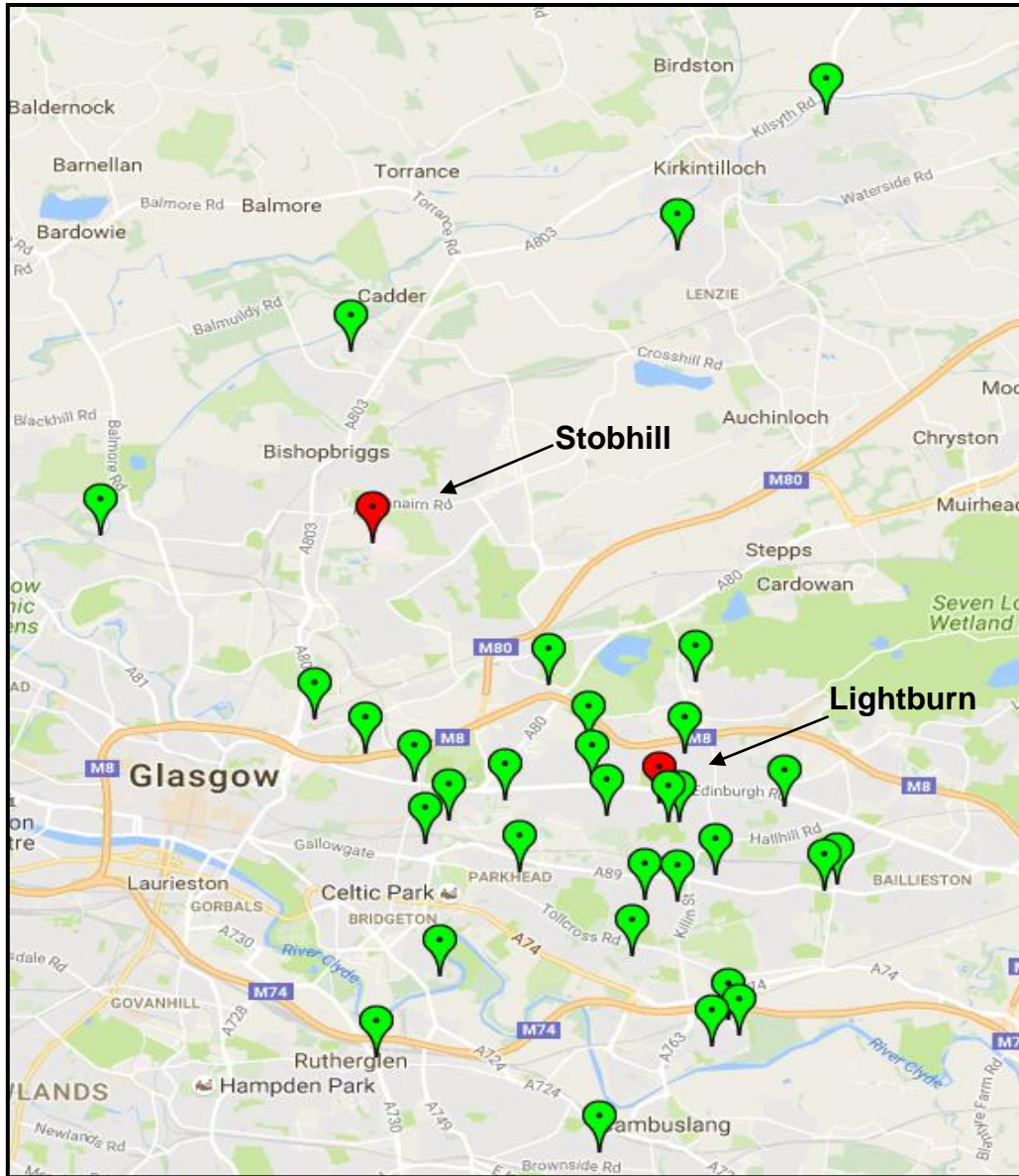
Who were they visiting and how often

- 37 were visiting a family member
- 3 were visiting friends

Of the 29 from the North and East of Glasgow 28 were visiting a family member and 1 was visiting a friend
