This issue of Core Brief details an NHSGGC news release on the twinning arrangement between the Royal Hospital for Children and the Institute of Child Health in Lahore.

Twinning arrangement between two children's hospitals

There was a little bit of Lahore spirit in Glasgow this morning, as a twinning arrangement between the two cities was signed at the Royal Hospital for Children.

Back in 2001, the Royal Hospital for Sick Hospital at Yorkhill began a twinning programme with the Children's Hospital and Institute of Child Health in Lahore to exchange knowledge and expertise. The Lahore hospital serves a local population of 10 million and a wider population in the Punjab of 60 million people. Since then the two hospitals have enjoyed a rich collaboration, working together on projects, staff exchanges, learning and education.

Professor Masood Sadiq made the journey from Lahore to renew the relationship with the new Royal Hospital for Children, which replaced Yorkhill in 2015. The new memorandum of understanding was signed in the hospital's atrium.
