Sod cutting for new £20m Woodside Health and Care Centre

A major milestone in the construction of the new Woodside Health and Care Centre took place today when the Cabinet Secretary for Health and Wellbeing, Shona Robison MSP, cut the first sod at a special ceremony.

This project represents a significant investment in the area with a cost of £20 million and will provide a wide range of benefits for the community it serves.

This includes the transfer of eight General Practices, one dental practice, one pharmacy and other primary and community care services from the current health centre, as well as the introduction of other services, including specialist children's services, community addictions services, social work services and an older person's day care service.

The new Centre is being delivered as a partnership with NHSGGC, Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership (HSCP), Glasgow City Council and Development Partner Hub West Scotland and their main contractor Morgan Sindall.

ABLE Bursary Fund

The Alison Bigrigg Legacy Education (ABLE) Innovation Fund is open to staff who have the potential to make a contribution to sexual and reproductive health and wellbeing.

Staff in any discipline and working in any service within NHSGGC are eligible to apply. This includes trainees and students on placement.
