



## Self Care Toileting

## **Level of Development Required**

Your child's readiness to toilet train is related to his or her level of growth and development. The following items are arranged according to physiological, motor, cognitive and language development and social skills. Some of the items on the list may not apply to your child. The more items that do apply, the more ready your child is likely to be, to begin toilet training.

## Readiness Checklist:

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Physiological Readiness	Motor Readiness
<ul> <li>My child is able to stay dry for at least an hour.</li> <li>My child's nappy is often dry after a nap.</li> <li>My child is aware of being wet or soiled.</li> <li>My child's bowel movements are solid and well formed.</li> <li>My child does not have bowel movements through the night.</li> <li>My child has regular bowel movements during the day.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>My child can sit with or without support.</li> <li>My child can walk with or without help.</li> <li>My child can move independently from one chair to another or participates actively when being moved using appropriate equipment.</li> <li>My child attempts to squat without losing his/her balance.</li> <li>My child is able to help dress/undress his/herself.</li> <li>My child can open doors independently.</li> <li>My child can manipulate small toys successfully.</li> </ul>
Cognitive Readiness	Language Readiness
<ul> <li>☐ My child searches for his/her toy.</li> <li>☐ My child imitates me or others.</li> <li>☐ My child plays make-believe.</li> <li>☐ My child can sit and play quietly for about 5 minutes.</li> <li>☐ My child is aware of when s/he needs to urinate or have a bowel movement.</li> <li>☐ My child is aware of what a potty/the toilet is for.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>My child understands simple requests like"         Where's Mummy".</li> <li>My child understands/responds to         instructions.</li> <li>My child is able to indicate his/her needs         using words, signs or gestures.</li> <li>My child has a name/sign for urine and         bowel movements.</li> <li>My child tells me when his/her pants are         wet/soiled.</li> <li>My child tells me when s/he needs to urinate         or have a bowel movement.</li> </ul>
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Social Readiness	Toileting Equipment
